

Developed Land of Montgomery Township, New Jersey

In the early 20th century, Montgomery's land cover was mostly devoted to agriculture, with the villages of Belle Mead, Blawenburg, Harlingen, and the NJ State Village for Epileptics (now Skillman Park), serving as the most developed sites in the township.

By the 1970's, agricultural land cover began to transition into the modern suburban landscape seen today, as unpaved roads, barns, pastures and orchards were replaced with residential subdivisions, shopping centers, and corporate parks.

Montgomery Township covers nearly 20,800 acres; 8,948 acres, or 43% of its total land cover, is designated as developed.
